

Fart Quest series by Aaron Reynolds






Funjungle series by Stuart Gibbs

The newly released 7th book in the popular bestselling FunJungle mystery series features 12-year-old Teddy Fitzroy's family trip to a ranch near Yellowstone


National Park where he tries to track down missing bison and a stolen necklace after a grizzly bear makes a surprising appearance.
