Preface

The purpose of this survey has been to document between one hundred and twenty and one hundred and fifty sites which are significant in local history, architecture, or culture so that appropriate steps can be taken to preserve a valuable part of our history.

The survey was compiled using written records, earlier surveys, maps and the memories of a great number of people who have spent their lives in Simsbury. The information recorded was usually verified by more than one source or was noted as being unconfirmed. The survey was completed to the standards of the State Historical Commission and includes information, photographs and maps locating one hundred and thirty-two sites. An additional forty sites were located and some information concerning these has been included. Time has not permitted the location of sites which have disappeared to be covered.

A number of people have helped me in the preparation and completion of this survey, but I would particularly like to thank the members of the Simsbury Town Plan Commission and the State Historical Commission for making this project possible.
